

PASTORAL LETTER

NOT A CURATE'S EGG

The expression 'A Curate's Egg' comes from a cartoon titled, 'True Humility', which appeared in *Punch* magazine in 1895. This depicts a meek curate who, given a stale egg at the bishop's table, assures his host that 'parts of it are excellent'. Whilst an egg cannot be 'good in parts' for most of us life is a mixture of experiences and events some wholly good and others far more difficult.

Our Rector, Peter is now two or so weeks into his long-deserved and longedfor sabbatical. Our prayers go with him for a wholly good period of rest, reflection, re-creation and returning refreshed in late September. Meanwhile life goes on and part of our life and role within the two churches in the Benefice is walking alongside others' 'rites of passage'; those significant life events including: baptisms (aka 'christenings'), weddings and funerals.

There have been a sobering number of funerals over the last few months for members of our communities who are sorely missed by family, friends, and neighbours. We have a number of weddings lined up for this summer in both of our beautiful churches and I am very much looking forward to performing my first two baptisms in Plaxtol Church at 11am on 2nd July.

In the first century, everyone who chose to follow Jesus Christ was turning intentionally away from whatever religious affiliations they had held before. The Roman emperor was worshipped as a god. Acknowledging Jesus as the only Lord and declaring allegiance to Him as God was rejecting Caesar and in effect both treason and blasphemy! Being baptized was a serious business! It still is, and I am very excited as two families and their chosen godparents declare their joint intention to bring these children up in the Christian faith. Do, please, join us for this important celebration and rite of passage.

Oh, and in case you're wondering, my experience and experiences since joining the Benefice in September 2022 have been wholly good. No curate's egg here, thank you!

Sunday 23 July	Kemsing to St Clere circular walk. Steady climb up the North Downs for great views to the South Downs on a clear day. Moderate difficulty.	5 miles
Wednesday 26 July	A golden opportunity for a flat walk from The Bell at Golden Green to East Peckham and back along the Medway. Moderate difficulty.	7 miles
Sunday 30 July	Penshurst and the Eden Valley: from Penshurst Place through fields, woodland and a vineyard. The final section of the walk is through the parkland of Penshurst estate and past Penshurst Church. Beautiful rural views. Moderate difficulty.	5.5 miles

July 6th marks our <u>1000th Market!</u> Come and celebrate with us (with cake, chocs and other nibbles!)

We celebrated our 20th Anniversary in May with a magnificent dinner prepared by Michel Roux Jr and his Event team (Michel was born in Shipbourne when his father was chef at the Fairlawne Estate). The Chaser very kindly allowed us to use their kitchens, erect a large marquee in their grounds where we invited 170 guests to spend a wonderful evening of food plus a fantastic cabaret given by Hal and Lara Cazelet.

The event run to raise money for agricultural charities and the St Giles' fabric fund and thanks to Michel Roux Jr and his team and the Cazalet family, as well as all attendees, sponsors of prizes and our stallholders, we will be able to donate over £10,000 to the charities.

After a cold (seemed like every morning) but dry June we can say that summer has final arrived. Raspberries and cherries have finally made their appearance. July is the best time to visit a Farmers Market as it is full of locally grown fruit, vegetables. In our case, Anabel's lamb is now available. Plus we can offer you views overlooking the Greensand Ridge on one side and the Common on the other.

The flavours and textures you find at the market exceed anything you get at the supermarket. Summer leaves such as spinach, mixed salad leaves can be used in salads, sandwiches and are the perfect match with grilled and barbecued meats and fish. Cherries are at their best now and far exceed the fluffy tasteless versions imported from other counties. Try them poached in red wine and served with vanilla ice cream or in a classic cherry pie, enlivened with chopped fresh mint. Raspberries are already in full swing and you will find the variety Maravilla, (as sold by Tom) is not only tasty but lasts longer (see menu). Try our really fresh strawberries and you'll soon realize why the supermarkets just can't compete!

Both Annabelle and Kieron have everything you need meat wise for your BBQ (if you want anything special just give them a call (see www.shipbournefm.co.uk) plus sourdough bread rolls supplied by Halstead bakery.

We not only have food at the market. Paula creates her many varieties of 'Handmade Soaps', wax melts, bath bombs all designed to enable you to pamper yourself using the best quality ingredients. Her soaps are based on two basic recipes: one containing coconut oil, palm oil, olive oil and sweet almond oil, and the other containing olive oil, coconut oil, avocado oil, shea butter and rice bran oil (palm oil free).

SEASONAL COOKERY CORNER

RASPBERRY SORBET

Serves 8-10

Ingredients

- 200g granulated sugar
- 500g raspberries, plus more to serve (optional)
- 1 lemon, juiced

Method

- 1. Stir sugar in 270ml water over a low heat until dissolved.
- 2. Raise the heat and simmer for 5 mins, until the liquid has become a syrup. Set aside to cool.
- 3. Put the raspberries and lemon juice in a food processor and blitz until smooth. Strain to remove seeds.
- 4. Combine with the sugar syrup, then pour into freezer-proof container.
- 5. Freeze for 1 hr 30 mins, then whisk with a balloon whisk or fork to break up any ice crystals that have formed and return to the freezer.
- 6. Then whisk again once an hour for 4 hrs to break up the ice crystals.

Serve with extra raspberries!
