

PASTORAL LETTER

MEET GOD ON THE JOURNEY

Our Rector Peter has just completed his pilgrimage by walking the 62 miles of St. Cuthbert's Way from Melrose in the Scottish Borders to the island of Lindisfarne.¹

Pilgrimage is common to many religious traditions. In a Christian context it is a journey undertaken intentionally, stepping out of one's usual time, space and comfort zone(s) and travelling slowly in silence and solitude, through new vistas, towards new horizons seeking a fresh encounter with God and a deeper understanding of oneself. For many people the destination is the sole initial focus. Of course, the destination is important, without one the pilgrimage would be aimless wandering! Nonetheless, the majority of those



with whom I have spoken discovered that it was the journey which proved most transformational by creating the space, silence and solitude for an encounter with God in a fresh context unconstrained by the unrelenting hurry of what passes for 'normal' daily life. Their journey prepared them for their destination which, became places of peace, rest and renewal. Not all journeys are easy and in balancing 'journey' and 'destination' pilgrimage is a good metaphor for life.

The Bible is full of individuals' encounters with God, many of which take place during an ordinary or, occasionally, extraordinary journey including: Hagar at the well, Moses at the burning bush, Elisha escaping from Queen Jezebel, the two disciples on the road to *and* from Emmaus and Paul on the road to Damascus.² The message I take is that whoever we may be or whatever our state of mind and heart whether dispirited, amazed, afraid, bemused, joyful or consumed with purpose, God awaits us on our life-journey, offering a transforming encounter.

So, why not create some space by taking a quiet walk by yourself in our beautiful benefice, say honestly what is on your heart and leave some space and silence into which the transcendent God who loves **you** can speak?

WHAT ARE YOU PLANNING TO DO ON SATURDAY 9TH SEPTEMBER?

Why not join thousands of other people, including hundreds in Kent, by taking part in the sponsored Ride and Stride to raise money for our church and for churches and chapels across the County?

Ride and Stride is a community event where you walk, cycle or even drive between churches and chapels of all denominations in any part of Kent of your choosing. You select your own route and visit as many buildings as you wish from a list of 700 participating churches and chapels. Go alone or with members of your family or your friends and have an enjoyable day out. Most churches you visit will have someone to welcome you and many provide refreshments.

The aim is to raise money for our wonderful legacy of church buildings by asking people - your family, friends, other members of the congregation and community - to sponsor you, giving either a fixed sum or an amount for each church you visit. Half the money you raise goes to your own church or chapel, the rest to the *Friends of Kent Churches* to help fund their grants for repairs and facilities at churches and chapels across Kent.

Ride and Stride raises about £130,000 a year and helps to fund grants ranging from a few hundred pounds to £25,000 to churches and chapels in Kent. Never has there been a greater need to raise money for church repairs.

WEST KENT RURAL GRANTS SCHEME

Following the approval of TMBC's investment plan to DEFRA for Rural England Prosperity Funding, the West Kent Rural Grant Scheme is now open for its first call for applications. This capital grant funding scheme is aimed at both rural businesses and communities (Parish Councils that are located within the eligible area can apply) and grants range from £2,000 to £25,000.

Thursday 3 August	A gentle stroll from the picturesque village of Matfield. Moderate difficulty.	5 miles
Sunday 6 August	A leisurely walk from Farleigh Green to cross the River Medway at Teston Bridge. Then follow the towpath past Barming Bridge and over East Farleigh Bridge to return through farmland, orchards and woodland. One short steep road climb. Lovely views over the Medway Valley and vineyards.	5.5 miles
Sunday 13 August	Brenchley South-West Loop: a leisurely and shady walk for summer with plenty of trees, lakes and ponds. Some hills and stiles and short sections on roads.	5.3 miles
Wednesday 16 August	Pushing out from The Boathouse - a leisurely flat walk from Yalding along the Medway to East Peckham and back.	5.5 miles
Sunday 20 August	Circular walk from Ide Hill to Toys Hill for great views to the south; then on to French Street and the Phillippines before we return via Emmetts Garden. Fairly hilly walk; moderate difficulty.	6 miles

Wednesday 23 August	Fish and Chip Supper walk: a short early evening walk from Wrotham up the Downs to build an appetite for a fish supper at the Rose and Crown. Moderate difficulty.	
Saturday 26 August	Walk from Borough Green to Basted Mill, then past Old Soar Manor and Dunks Green to Shipbourne for a picnic lunch and/or drinks from The Chaser. AUGUST AT SHIPBOURNE FARMERS MARKET

Following our 20th Anniversary and our 100th market we are now heading into peak harvest time so make the most of the abundance of fresh vegetables and soft fruit and plan time for some preserving so that you can continue to enjoy great ingredients through the colder months. Make your own jams, chutneys and



pickles now, and leave them to mature in a cool dark place to allow the flavours to meld and develop. They will be at their best just in time for Christmas and make perfect presents.

Tomatoes, in all kinds of varieties, are in abundance and taste superb right now, as do shallots, onions, French and runner beans, courgettes, aubergine, peppers, cucumber, and an amazing number of salad leaves,. Corn on the cob is an August highlight and should be cooked and eaten as fresh as possible before the natural sugars turn to starch. To cook on the BBQ protect the cob by leaving on their leaves and serve with a lime and chilli butter. Early marrows and squashes should also be available, along with main crop potatoes.

The soft fruit season is still in full swing for **raspberries**, **currents**, **plums**, **blueberries** and **blackberries** (cherries may still available). Now is the time to buy soft fruit and convert it into jams, ice cream or store in the freezer to bring a taste of the summer to the winter months. Take a tip from the French and bottle the best quality fruit in alcohol such as eau de vie, vodka or brandy.

Summer fish is plentiful this month. **Salmon** and **sea trout** are always a treat and cook as simply as possible to preserve their flavour. **Sole, sea bass and plaice** are also excellent now. Continue to enjoy mackerel on the barbecue where their oily flesh keeps its wonderful texture so well. However, Mike will be out of action for August as he is having a rotator cuff op. So we **recommend you BUY NOW and FREEZE.**

Annabelle's new season lamb is now available. They have now been reared on grass for 6 months (compared to the normal 3-4 months for supermarket bred lamb). The BBQ is the perfect way to make the most of it, try a butterflied leg of lamb, cooked whole on the barbecue. Marinate overnight in yogurt and spices then barbecue and served piled into flat bread with barbecued vegetables. (Call

Annabelle to order). You will also find some interesting sausage combinations perfect for the BBQ – try wild boar and apple, venison, and even pork flavoured with hops. Finish off with a Winterdale cheese board and artisan bread.

Finally, don't forget that the Glorious 12th this marks the start of the new game season so look out for **venison**, **wild duck**, **wood pigeon** and rabbit towards the end of the month

SEASONAL COOKERY CORNER

GAZPACHO (COLD TOMATO) SOUP

Preparation time: 20 minutes / Serves 4

Ingredients

- 500g ripe red tomatoes
- 1/2 a small cucumber, peeled and chopped
- 1 small red and 1 green pepper, chopped
- 1 small red onion, chopped
- 250ml tomato juice and 250ml vegetable stock
- Handful of fresh basil leaves
- 1 large clove of garlic, crushed
- 1 tsp harissa paste
- 1 tbsp red wine vinegar and 4 tbsp good olive oil

Method

- Put tomatoes in a bowl and cover with boiling water. After 2 minutes drain and slip the skins from the tomatoes (discard skins).
- Add skinned tomatoes and all other ingredients into a blender and blitz until smooth.
- Allow to chill in the fridge for at least 2 hours to let the flavours develop.
- Serve with a drizzle of olive oil and a few torn basil leaves.
