



LITTER & GRAFFITI – MESSAGE FROM TOM TUGENDHAT

We all know how unsightly and frustrating it is to see graffiti, litter, and fly-tipping throughout our community. In recent weeks I have received a number of emails from residents asking what can be done to improve the situation. This is an issue in town centres, villages, and rural areas alike.

Graffiti is the responsibility of the land or property owner to remove. If it occurs on land owned by Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council or Sevenoaks District Council then they will look to remove is as soon as possible. If you see graffiti on private land then you can also notify Kent Police.

However, to make it easier for you, I have decided to set-up my own online reporting tool below. You can fill out the relevant form to let me know where the graffiti or littering has taken place. I will then pass this on to either the Council or the landowner for it to be either cleaned up or removed.

TMBC ANNUAL CANVASS

Annual Canvass is the annual check of the Electoral Register, to ensure we have all eligible residents registered in the correct properties. **It will run from July until the end of November**, when we will then publish the updated register on 1 December 2023.

Just a reminder about the changes to the process. It was ascertained that a high percentage of people do not move each year, so resources are wasted chasing people to respond, when there have not been any changes in registration in the property. Also the new process allows us to make use of other ways of contacting electors to ascertain if everyone in the household is registered, such as email and telephone.

The process starts by uploading our register data via the Cabinet Office to the DWP site, on a set date, to be compared with the DWP data. Our date was **28 July 2023**. From this comparison the entries either match (green) or don't (red). The results were sent back down to us the following day and have been downloaded into our electoral system. Then the households are set into 3 routes.

Route 1 – Households that have matched 75 % – likelihood is there are no changes to these properties – these Households will receive either:

- an email, (if we have an email address for someone in the property), informing them of the details we hold, which they **must** respond to, to confirm that the details are correct or changes made, if they do not respond they will then receive a CCA letter.
- Or a letter (if no email addresses held), CCA, which informs them of the details we hold, which they only must respond to if there are any changes. No further chasing is undertaken.

Route 2-Households that have not matched due to possible changes in the property 24.9% – these households will receive up to 3 communications from us, a Canvass Form, an email reminder (if we have an email address for that property), a telephone call (if

we have a telephone number), or as a last resort a house visit from a canvasser with a tablet, followed by a final reminder Canvass form.

Route 3 – These are properties that are different to normal households, such as care homes, HMO's, etc. There will be a letter sent initially and then they will be contacted either by telephone or in person to arrange a visit.

We have started with the **Route 2** Properties this year, their Canvass forms left on **15 August**. VRO's will be chasing nonresponses from around **8 September**. Then we will send the **Route 1** Property communications mid-September and lastly **Route 3** at the end of October.

Please respond, via one of the digital routes, either online, telephone or text, not only to reduce the amount of paper the team will have to handle, but to save much needed Borough funds.

ELIGIBLE RESIDENTS URGED TO TAKE UP VACCINE OFFERS

People aged 65 and over are among Kent and Medway's vulnerable residents to be offered a COVID-19 booster and a flu vaccination this Autumn, the Department of Health and Social Care has confirmed. Kent County Council Director of Public Health, Dr Anjan Ghosh, said: "We are now living with COVID-19, as well as flu, and eligible groups will benefit most from vaccination. "I urge any resident who qualifies to take up the offers when they become available to increase your protection ahead of winter, when respiratory viruses are usually at their peak." Medway Council Director of Public Health, James Williams, said: "Getting vaccinated is the best way to protect yourself and reduce your risk of becoming unwell. "I would encourage anyone who is eligible to get their flu and COVID-19 booster, particularly those with a weakened immune system as they are at greater risk if they get infected."

Groups eligible for a COVID-19 booster this Autumn include:

- people age 65 years and over
- residents in care homes for older adults
- anyone 6 months to 64 years in a clinical risk group
- carers and close contacts of people with immunosuppression, and
- frontline health and social care workers.

FROM YOUR LOCAL MP

Each year I run an annual school bus survey, and this year is no different. The purpose of the survey is to allow parents and students to share their experiences of getting the bus to school.

September is always a tricky time for any parent, with our children going into a new school year and sometimes a new school entirely. This brings a change to the routine and our travel plans too.

I work closely with Schools, Bus Operators and Kent County Council (KCC) to make sure that any changes in travel patterns from one year to the next are addressed quickly. But to do that I need to know what is working, and what isn't working.

Across Tonbridge, Edenbridge and Malling there are tens of different bus routes serving our different Secondary Schools as well as ones that go further afield to Schools in nearby towns such as Maidstone, Sevenoaks and Tunbridge Wells.

While I know that a good number of people reading this may not be of school age, I'd be very grateful if you could pass it on to family members who you think may find it useful, It really helps me hearing from you on what can be done to improve the services and I know that KCC and the bus companies are also grateful.

I have been running this survey annually to allow parents and students to feedback on the quality of their bus service at the start of the new year. Once I have collected responses I will be in touch with the bus companies, schools, and KCC to see what can be done to correct any issues. It offers a fantastic opportunity for you to have a say.

SEPTEMBER AT SHIPBOURNE FARMERS MARKET (Local produce made/grown by Local producers)

Footfall in late summer has always been impacted by shoppers going on holiday as soon as the new school term starts. There has been a distinct drop maybe also caused by the September heatwave when we found almost 80% of customers came before 10am! However we



have finally spotted the return of a few foreign tourists which has helped make up our numbers.

September saw the start of the apple season and now October is THE month for **apples and dessert pears.** They are now be at their peak. Try as many local varieties as possible, whether for eating with local cheeses or cooking in pies, puddings and preserves.

Although w have just experienced the hottest September the longer nights combined with the changing season heralds a longing for richer, more comforting meat dishes and it's the start of the game season with **pheasant** appearing once again at the market later in the month. Lean and tender, it suits quick cooking methods such as frying and grilling. Try them with mushrooms the perfect partner for seasonal game

Kentish Cobnuts and walnuts are all ripening. Use in autumn salads or toasted with fruit compotes or meringues for impact. You will also find them in Tom Cannon's delicious and healthy breakfast granola. (This is not the variety filled out with sugars, preservatives etc found elsewhere!

Much of our seafood is at its best when caught in colder waters, so as the sea temperature starts to drops the choice of fish gets better and better. **Sea bass, skate**, **Dover sole**, **plaice**, **turbot**, **cod and haddock** are all good at this time of year.

Onions, leeks, beetroot, carrots and tomatoes are all full of flavour at this time of year whilst **squashes and pumpkins** offer much more for the cook than merely lanterns for Halloween. Use them in soups, stews, bakes and pickles for rich seasonal colour and taste.

With the heatwave in September, helping to improve the sugar content, this year looks to be yet another bumper season for our **Kentish wine growers**. Did you know we have a selection of quality very local wines at the market? Although you may think morning tastings are a bit early, Gordon, our own sommelier, is on hand to explain how the wines are made and make sure you will be surprised by the taste and quality of the product at that time!

SEASONAL COOKERY CORNER

BRACE OF PHEASANT STEW WITH MUSHROOMS AND BACON

Serves 6 / Prep 10 mins / Cook for 1 1/2 - 2 hours

- 3 pheasant breasts and 3 legs (or 2 pheasants (i.e. a brace) cut up)
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil and 2 tablespoons of butter
- 375gram mushrooms (cut into quarters))2 large onions (roughly chopped)
- 3 rashers of streaky bacon (roughly chopped)
- 30-gram flour
- 600ml red wine
- 600ml chicken stock
- 2 garlic cloves
- salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1. Brown the pheasant pieces in a casserole in the oil and butter.
- 2. Take out, and cook mushrooms until tender (about 5 mins).
- 3. Take out and cook the onions. Take out and cook the bacon
- 4. Reduce the amount of fat in the casserole to about 2 tablespoons and stir in the flour with the bacon and cook stirring until brown.
- 5. Stir in the wine, bring to boil and simmer for 5 minutes.
- 6. Add back the pheasant pieces, mushrooms, onions, garlic plus the stock.
- 7. Cover and simmer until the meat is tender stirring from time to time to prevent it sticking. (This could take 1-2 hours depending on the age of the bird).
- 8. Serve with mashed potatoes, or better still, oven cooked sweet potato wedges, and savoy or red cabbage.
