



CHRISTMAS IS COMING!

This year, the preparatory season of Advent is as short as it can be, with Sunday 24th doubling as both the Fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve. As Christmas Day moves on to a Monday, it is a challenge to fit everything in without shipping important fixtures out, way too early, into the middle of December!



At the same time, we're aware that everybody has different expectations. The most popular church event is clearly the **Carol Service**, and while some long for this to be a local version of the service at King's College, Cambridge others prefer an indoor version of the Carol Singing that normally takes place in the street. In reality our **Carol Services** are neither of these, but somewhere in the middle. We love to tell the Christmas story; our choristers, who sing faithfully on Sundays week by week throughout the year, look forward to doing their bit while members of the community want to have a good sing, too. We also want to strike a balance where atmosphere and stillness can play a part in communicating the holiness of the season... while making it abundantly clear that all ages are welcome at everything.

We are pleased to have a renewed invitation to do *Carols and Sketches* at the **Kentish Rifleman** on Tues 19th at 5pm. This is the earliest Christmas event. We usually do a **'Bethlehem Live!'** event in Plaxtol, but the way the days fall this years makes it impossible – so we are having a similar costumed **Nativity Service** in Plaxtol Church at 11am of Christmas Eve. Likewise, we are going to try something new at **Midnight Communion** (11.30 pm at Plaxtol, without either choir or congregational singing, but using the beautiful music of Enya to create a meditative or 'immersive' telling of the Christmas mysteries. So do please take a moment to think about your expectations and to consider the different formats and 'feels' that are on offer over Christmas. Above all, we long to celebrate with you the **Joy** of the Christmas message: that God loves the world so much that he sent his son to be **with us – Emmanuel!**

THE ST GILES' CHURCH RESTORATION APPEAL

The total of gifts, pledges, grants and income from events has now reached more than £118,000 to add to the £100,000 which the church can contribute from its reserves, so we are not far from the £231,000 which was our original target. In practice we will need to raise a bit more than that target because of inflation in building costs since we began. However, this has been a splendid effort and thank you again for your great generosity.

We plan to go to tender in the spring and to carry out the main works during the summer when the weather should be more helpful for the kind of work we need to do.

Meanwhile, though, a separate project has already begun to tackle the repeated flooding of our crypt in recent years as the result of a collapsed drain. The drain cannot be easily repaired, so we are installing an electric sump-pump to remove water at times of heavy rainfall. We are also re-wiring the crypt because the existing circuits have failed because of the flooding. Our appeal continues and the Farmers' Market will be selling packs of Christmas Cards designed by young local artists, the proceeds of which will go to the appeal. And look out for the Quiz Night which we will be organising in the New Year.

FREE HOME ENERGY UPGRADES AVAILABLE NOW

Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council is helping residents save on energy use and make their homes warmer with the Home Upgrade Grant Scheme – open now.

Residents who rely on oil, electricity, liquid petroleum gas (LPG), coal, or wood to heat their homes could dramatically improve their home's energy efficiency for free and save money in the long run. Under the scheme, measures including insulation, air source heat pumps and solar panels are all available to residents that meet certain criteria.

Home Upgrade checklist:

- Does your heating source include oil, electricity, LPG, coal, or wood?
- Is your household income below £31,000 annually? (Earning threshold varies in some postcode areas).

FROM YOUR LOCAL MP

A couple of months ago I wrote in The Shipbourne Newsletter about the Mayor of London's plans to scrap Day Travelcards, which would make travel to London much less convenient for us all.

The importance of the Day Travelcard is shown every time we are at the station. I am sure we have all seen people at Tonbridge Station who are not regular travellers, won't have an Oyster card but need to get the tube when they reach London Charing Cross. The Day Travelcard is the easiest ticket to buy. Without this option I have no doubt that fewer people would travel, which is not only bad for us but bad for the economy in London.

I received an overwhelming response to my request to hear from those affected and am very grateful to everyone who took the time to share their thoughts with me. Across our community I heard from hundreds of people. We received the wonderful news a few weeks ago that the Mayor of London has reversed his decision and the Day Travelcard is here to stay. This decision would have hit the poorest in our community the hardest and put off so many people from visiting London. Thank you to everyone who responded to my request.

In less positive news I also wanted to use my column to reflect on the terrible events we have seen in the Middle East over recent weeks. I have been working closely with communities here across the country who are affected by what is happening in Israel and Gaza and through my role as Security Minister I will continue to do what I can to ensure that the security of the UK, including every one of us in Tonbridge and Malling is protected.

Getting into the Christmas spirit

The market will be open every Thursday as usual and for an hour (9am - 10am) on the 23rd as our 'Pick Up' market. On December 7th we shall be visited by Shipbourne School choir to sing **Christmas carols**



We are planning to have Christmas cards designed by some of our younger artists in the village which will be sold in packs of five in aid of the St Giles' Restoration Appeal.

We have added a few additional stalls for Christmas and welcome back 'Patisserie Lingaud' (Ira) 'real' chocolates and 'The Flower Hut' (Jo) who will be bringing Christmas wreaths, table decorations and bulbs.

To order Christmas produce in advance individual stallholders will organize their own order lists so please ask them for their Order List and make sure you order as early as possible.

Support your local producers and buy local this Christmas. We have a great selection of **meats** – maybe a haunch of venison, or a magnificent roast of beef on the bone, pork, or lamb? Or keep with tradition and stick to turkey or goose. If you are catering for smaller numbers how about pheasant or duck? For fish lovers smoked salmon, fresh turbot or halibut are available (please order in advance). Whatever you choose, buying locally means you are supporting small local producers and have the satisfaction of caring for the environment too.

We also have a great selection of vegetables so try something different. If you are unsure how to cook (or store) it have a look at our 'What's In season' section of our web site (www.kfma.org.uk) where we are building a comprehensive directory of produce in season plus how to prep it and store it.

We also have all sorts of **cheeses**, **nuts and oils** (for cooking and dressings) vital to make the perfect party as well as locally made

quality **Christmas presents** such as mittens, scarves and head gear made by **Rosemary** from wool provided by her herd of **alpacas**, **Paula** not only makes soaps for every occasion but are created as works of art. **Ightham Wooden Products** have wooden Christmas decorations and various sizes of Cheese boards (the perfect present). Or how about some interesting spirits made by our own local **Greensand Distillery** or sparkling and still wines to rival the best in the UK, created by our local vineyards: **Yotes Court** and **Meophams**, or the **different varieties of Apple Juice** from **Roughway Farm**. To improve your leftovers once Christmas Day is over, try the variety of chutneys made by **Winsford House Produce**.

Stock up with **artisan breads** made by Pierre and Av at **Halstead Bakery**. They all freeze extremely well so make sure you have enough to last you through Christmas (to go with turkey sandwiches or a bowl of soup!).

SEASONAL COOKERY CORNER

CHRISTMAS SPICED RED CABBAGE

A most flexible dish. It can be served hot or cold, and actually gets better when left to mature for a day or two. It goes with all kinds of dishes. Serve with the main event on Christmas Day but make enough for leftovers to go with cold meats on Boxing Day and beyond.

Serves 8 / Prepare 15 mins / Cook 1½ to 2 hours

- 1 tbsp local rape seed oil
- 1 large onion, sliced
- 1 tsp ground coriander, ½ tsp ground cinnamon, ¼ tsp freshly grated nutmeg
- 750g red cabbage, finely shredded
- 1 large eating apple, cored and chopped
- 2 tbsp soft brown sugar
- 5 tbsp red wine vinegar
- 4 tbsp cranberry or redcurrant jelly
- 1. Heat oil in a large pan, add onion and cook for 3 minutes until softened. Stir in spices and cook for another minute. Add shredded red cabbage and stir to coat with spices then stir in the apple, sugar, vinegar and 4 tbsp cold water.
- 2. Season with salt and pepper and bring to the boil. Cover and simmer very gently for 1½ to 2 hours, stirring occasionally, until really tender and the liquid has evaporated. Stir in the jelly and serve hot or cold.
- 3. The classic sweet and sour flavours go wonderfully with all rich meats so serve with sausages and roast pork, game, creamy potato dishes, and cold with pates and sliced hams.
