

PASTORAL LETTER

NEW YEAR – PRIORITY FOR PRAYER

As another year dawns I have in many different ways sensed a new priority for prayer – both for myself and for the church. Prayer is a collective term for the many different ways in which we raise our souls and bodies to God. It can be individual

and corporate; it can be noisy and silent; in can use words or refrain from doing so altogether. Prayer is necessary – like the beating heart or the breathing lungs of the life of faith; without prayer we asphyxiate! It's easy to be distracted from prayer in the busy lives we all lead, so priorities need to set, and time set aside.

For Anglicans, prayer is most often a formal thing, with books and hymns and readings. Consequentially some people feel less comfortable or less confident when prayer is extempore, and even silence can feel threatening. But unless these things are embraced, they will never be normalised, and without learning to be still, we may never learn to hear God... and, of course, prayer is very definitely a two-way communication.

So, this year we are going to begin putting new time aside for prayer, calling these new 30-minutes session '**Still Small Voice'** - see (1 Kings 19:12).

- **Sunday 8th January 11am** (after the morning service) at St Giles Shipbourne;
- **Sunday 8th January 10am** (before the morning service) at Plaxtol Church.

Please consider setting a new priority for prayer and, if you think these sessions might be a helpful encouragement, you would be most welcome.

I've often said that being Anglican means being part of something bigger. As well as our parish and our benefice of two parishes, we are part of Shoreham Deanery. The Benefice of Eynsford, Farningham and Lullingstone, at the North end of our Deanery is now in vacancy and, because we now have two priests in our benefice, we have offered to share resources once per month. If Mark or I are not in church on Sundays, and not away for other reasons, it may be that we're away helping in the North of the Deanery. Please pray for us and for them as we seek to help in this way.

CLIMATE CHANGE

You are invited to a winter get together to hear about Shipbourne's recently adopted Climate Change Strategy. Join us at our meeting at 7.00pm for refreshments to hear more about our strategy and how we can all contribute to mitigating climate change and reduce our carbon footprint.

Shipbourne Parish Council declared a Climate Emergency in 2019 and are working towards net Zero by 2030. The Parish Council are putting together an audit and have found that our carbon footprint is low. Milage for Parish business is minimal as most Councillors walk to the meetings or only travel a short distance. Many external meeting and training sessions are now held virtually which had reduced the milage considerably. We only meet 11 times a year so use a minimal amount of electricity in the village hall. Councillors have been encouraged to view meeting papers online so we have also reduced the amount of paper and printing ink that we use. If you want to work out your carbon footprint, there are many resources online.

At our October meeting, we adopted a Climate Change Strategy and Action Plan. This is now available on our website under Policy or via the Parish Clerk at shipbourneparishcouncil@gmail.com

TONBRIDGE & MALLING BOROUGH COUNCIL - PUBLIC SPACE PROTECTION ORDER CONSULTATION

The Borough Council is currently consulting on its proposals for Public Space Protection Orders. As well as continuing with current restrictions (around dog fouling, public urination and use of drones etc) they are also proposing four new restrictions on nuisance parking in public open spaces and car or motorcycle meets, a ban on fishing at Tonbridge Town Lock and on swimming, boating and bathing at Holborough Lakes, near Snodland.

Now that the Christmas period is well behind us we can begin to look forward to what 2023 has in store for us. Over the last few months both myself and Tonbridge and Malling Conservatives have been campaigning for a regeneration of the former Beales unit in the heart of Tonbridge.

For many of us Tonbridge is the nearest town, where we look to for services we can't find in the village. We all need to make sure it continues to thrive. By letting Sainsbury's know how important the former Beales unit is to us, we can ensure they bring forward plans for regeneration as quickly as possible.

As the long-term leaseholder Sainsbury's are the only organisation who can do this. It's been three years now since Beales closed. Three years empty is plenty.
