PASTORAL LETTER

GOD SAVE THE KING!

It's an odd thing to say, but only those in our community who are over 70 years of age will have an experience of a coronation. For many people it's a once-in-a-lifetime event. The last one, which took place, on 2nd June 1953 (my mum's 13th birthday!) was the



first really big 'outing' for the BBC, as television was so new then. Many of those who can remember it will recall crowding round a small black-and-white cathode-ray-tube housed in a brown bake-olite box in a 'rich' neighbour's house. Today, very few people don't have a television, and some that do own multiple mega-mahoosive ones, so the experience will likely be better... if less neighbourly. Our respective communities have put on various other special events, so there should be plenty of time for... rejoicing!

The King shall rejoice in your strength, O Lord! Psalm 21 v1

On the Sunday of coronation weekend, the two parishes of our benefice will be combining, this time in Plaxtol, at the Cricket Ground for open-air worship. We will recall the biblical texts that form the lyrics to two of our nation's favourite Coronation anthems, one of which is above. And we will rejoice with other great praise songs too. Our National Anthem, which we will also sing together, is a simple but profound prayer to God for our King, Charles III. We hope you will be able to join us at 10.30am. All are welcome!

ST GILES' CHURCH RESTORATION APPEAL

Our appeal to raise the $\pounds 280,000$ to fund the major repairs needed to the Church continues to go very well. The Church's reserves and a government grant that will be available to cover the cost of VAT will fund the first $\pounds 150,000$ of this sum but we need to raise the rest locally and from grants.

The appeal has so far raised about $\pounds 57,400$ in just two months, a marvellous effort and we are very grateful indeed for all your offers of help. Of the amount raised so far, over $\pounds 40,000$ has come from donations, the rest from promised grants. This is a tremendous start but we still need another $\pounds 73,000$. We have a number of grant applications outstanding which we hope will take us some way towards this figure but, being realistic, much of it will need to be raised locally.

If you have not yet made a donation or pledge, please consider doing so:

HIS MAJESTY KING CHARLES III PLANS TO MARK THE CORONATION SATURDAY 6TH MAY – MONDAY 8TH MAY

The Lord-Lieutenant, The Lady Colgrain has been advised of further details from The King's Household to mark the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III where people from across the UK and the Commonwealth will come together to celebrate this historic event.

Saturday 6th May – Coronation Service

The centrepiece of the Coronation weekend is the Westminster Abbey Service due to take place in the morning. The Service will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Service will reflect the Monarch's role today and look towards the future, while being rooted in longstanding traditions and pageantry.

Their Majesties The King and The Queen Consort will arrive at Westminster Abbey in procession from Buckingham Palace, known as 'The King's Procession'. After the Service, Their Majesties will return to Buckingham Palace in a larger ceremonial procession, known as 'The Coronation Procession'. Their Majesties will be joined in this procession by other Members of the Royal Family. At Buckingham Palace, The King and The Queen Consort, accompanied by Members of the Royal Family, will appear on the balcony to conclude the day's ceremonial events.

Sunday 7th May – Coronation Big Lunch

Communities will come together to arrange street parties, gatherings in parks, gardens and community spaces to mark the Coronation. 'The Big Lunch' team, supported by The Eden Project, will provide downloadable resources via The Coronation Big Lunch

Her Majesty The Queen Consort has been Patron of the Big Lunch since 2013.

The Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) has written to all Local Authorities in England asking them to be supportive of requests for Street Parties. Guidance on how to organise a street party can be found here You can also highlight more guidance on Street Meets which offers easier ways to bring communities together.

DLUHC has expressed its support for any Councils wishing to organise Coronation events and celebrations within their towns and cities and to utilise any of their council-owned civic amenities in order to do so. Large screens in public places can be used to show television coverage of the Coronation which could include the Ceremony and Procession on Saturday 6th May or indeed the Coronation Concert on the evening of Sunday 7th May. These screenings could be complemented or enhanced by being part of a wider local event if deemed appropriate and can be safely managed.

Sunday 7th May – Coronation Concert

On Sunday a special Coronation Concert will take place at Windsor Castle, produced, staged and broadcast live by the BBC. The BBC will arrange for several thousand pairs of tickets to be made available via a public ballot. The audience will also include volunteers from The King and The Queen Consort's many charity affiliations,

The concert will see a world-class orchestra play interpretations of musical favourites by some of the world's biggest entertainers, alongside performers from the world of dance. The performances will be supported by staging and effects located on the Castle's East Lawn and will also feature a selection of spoken word sequences delivered by stars of stage and screen. There will also be an exclusive appearance from The Coronation Choir. This diverse group will be created from the nation's keenest community choirs and amateur singers from across the United Kingdom, such as Refugee choirs, NHS choirs, LGBTQ+ singing groups and deaf signing choirs. The Coronation Choir will appear alongside The Virtual Choir, made up of singers from across the Commonwealth, for a special performance on the night.

The centrepiece of the Coronation Concert, 'Lighting up the Nation', will see the country join together in celebration as iconic locations across the United Kingdom are lit up using projections, lasers, drone displays and illuminations.

Monday 8th May - The Big Help Out

This event is being organised by The Together Coalition and will include support from partners such as the Royal Voluntary Service, Faith Groups from around the United Kingdom and the Scouts. This initiative will highlight the positive impact volunteering has on communities and the satisfaction it can bring to people giving up their time to volunteer and bring about change.

Recalling His Majesty's lifelong dedication to public service, supported by The Queen Consort and other Members of the Royal Family, it is hoped that this initiative will provide an opportunity for communities to come together and support a whole range of volunteering initiatives to create a lasting legacy. The Coronation programme will build on the Heritage Fund's Platinum Jubilee programme from 2022, with a £7 million commitment to help communities across the UK reconnect with nature and support young people who have chosen a career in natural heritage. MAY AT SHIPBOURNE FARMERS MARKET

May will be our busiest month at the market. Not only is everything really starting to grow (finally!) but we are getting ready for the visit and feast prepared by Shipbourne's famous chef Michel Roux Jr and his La Gavroche team.



Not only will a good time be had by all but it enables us to both earn and donate a to both Farming charities and St Giles' Church Repair fund.

With the longer days and the warmer spring sunshine the first signs of the bounty to come has arrived. **Asparagus**, one of the great treats of the season, is at its best when picked and cooked within hours, something easily achievable when bought locally at the market. Make the most of the delicate **flavour** by serving simply steamed with melted butter or a hollandaise sauce. As the season progresses use in risottos, tarts, salads and soups.

River trout infused with Greensand gin will form the starter for the Roux dinner and Mikey's **wild sea trout** is one of the season's great treats. **Lemon sole, cod, halibut** and **sea bass** are all good at this time of year and shellfish fans should keep an eye out for **razor clams** and **cockles**.

Kieron's loin of **venison** will form the basis of our main dish However, Annabelle's **beef and pork** will be at their most succulent as the grazing starts to green up. Now is the time to splash out on steaks, chops and fillets and use them simply cooked – grilled, stir fried or griddle cooked for lighter meals.

Alongside asparagus other spring vegetables are also starting to appear after the cold of the winter. Look out for are tender little early **new potatoes**, Leaves such as **spinach**, **watercress**, **rocket** and **lettuces** can now be found sitting alongside the last of this year's main vegetable crop of purple sprouting broccoli, spring cabbage, cauliflower, spring greens, spring onions and radishes. **Radishes**, **spring onions and samphire** mean that lighter eating is now an easy choice for the cook.

Honey Panna Cotta with a chilled rhubarb champagne consommé will form our dessert course. Try 'Green' i.e. **outdoor rhubarb** in lighter dishes such as homemade ice creams and fools. Or make your own rhubarb jams and chutneys – the tart flavour of the fruit makes a lovely preserve to spread on scones, fill sponge cakes and enjoy simply on buttered toast, particularly if you add ginger as a flavouring.

By the end of the month the earliest **gooseberries** should be available, ready to pair up with their perfect partner – delicate fragrant elderflowers. Just add a head or two of creamy white flowers (pick away from roads or sprayed fields and shake to remove bugs) to the gooseberries for a few minutes as they cook then lift out and discard. The distinctive flavour will remain for crumbles, cakes, fools or creamy desserts such as crème brûlées and panna cotta.

COOKERY CORNER

CHICKEN AND ASPARAGUS

This delicious classic combination is quick to prepare. Serve it with steamed new potatoes and a green salad

Serves 4/Prep 10 minutes/Cook 25 minutes

- 25g butter
- 4 chicken breast fillets, cut into thick lengths, seasoned with salt and pepper
- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 2 tbsp plain flour
- 100ml dry white wine
- 300ml chicken stock
- juice and finely grated rind of 1 lemon
- 450g bunched asparagus, trimmed and cut into 5cm lengths
- 100ml local double cream
- 2 3 tbsp each chopped fresh mint and parsley

- 1. Melt the butter in a medium heavy-based pan, add the chicken strips and brown lightly on all sides over a medium high heat. Remove from the pan and set aside.
- 2. Add the onion to the pan and cook over a low heat until lightly coloured. Return the chicken and any juices to the pan. Sprinkle over the flour, stir and let it cook for a minute.
- 3. Increase the heat and add the white wine and keep stirring. Gradually add the stock and lemon juice and bring to the boil. Keep stirring. Lower the heat and simmer gently for about 5 minutes until the chicken is nearly cooked through.
- 4. Add the asparagus and seasoning. Push the asparagus under the surface of the liquid. Simmer for about 5 minutes until the asparagus is just tender.
- 5. Stir in the cream, lemon rind and chopped herbs and heat through back to simmering point. Check seasoning before serving
- 6. Serve with new potatoes and a green salad.
