

RESTORATION WORK TO START AT ST GILES'

After 16 months of fundraising, in which we have gathered almost £150,000 from gifts, grants and events to add to the £100,000 allocated from reserves by the Parochial Church Council, our restoration project is about to start. Having invited tenders, we have awarded the contract to DBR London Ltd, a reputable building firm with a history of working on historic buildings, including churches. They will employ specialist subcontractors for roofing, windows, glass and so forth.

We hope that scaffolding the building, which will itself take 3 weeks, will start early in July. The project is expected to take about 4 months and the church will remain in normal use throughout. The farmers market will not be affected.

We had feared that the work might be delayed because of the presence of bats but while our ecologist consultants have found some common species using the building, so far there is no evidence of a maternity roost, so we hope that getting a licence from Natural England for our project will be straightforward.

Luckily the successful tender came in rather lower than we had expected and we shall have some money left over with which to carry out further work on the building. We even hope that we may be able to raise enough to clean and repair the paintings covering the chancel walls, which were severely damaged by a leaking roof in the distant past. The congregation have long wanted to restore these paintings and now we may be able to do it.

Thank you again for your great generosity because without your help none of this could happen. We will give further updates as the work progresses.

ST GILES' SHIPBOURNE AND THE VANES: 150 YEARS AT FAIRLAWNE

A New Heritage Trail: St Giles' Shipbourne and the Vanes: 150 Years at Fairlawne, created by members of the Arts Society -Sevenoaks, will be launched in the church on Saturday 13 July, at 16:00, as part of the Benefice Silver Jubilee Weekend celebrations. The trail, inspired by the magnificent Barnard memorial, designed by James Gibbs, in the Vane chapel in the church, explores the lives of Christopher Vane, the first Lord Barnard, together with his argumentative wife, his father, Sir Henry Vane the younger, his grandfather Sir Henry Vane the Elder - and his grandson William, Viscount Vane and wife Frances the last Vanes to live at Fairlawne. The trail is illustrated with six portraits, including reproductions of paintings by Sir Peter Lely and Mary Beale - one of the first professional women artists of the 17th century. A short exhibition in the Vane chapel explores in more detail 150 years of the Vanes at Fairlawne, their links to the current members of the Vane families and the castles they live in, as well as a look at the work of Gibbs and Mary Beale. The exhibition will be on until early September.

Last chance to see the previous trail and exhibition: *St Giles' Shipbourne and the Cazalets: Six Portraits by Six Artists*, which will be taken down on Friday 12 July - open every day from 9:00am to 5:00 pm.

Wednesday 17 July	Linear walk from Wrotham following Stage 10 of the Pilgrims Way to Halling. Lovely views towards Trottiscliffe and Ryarsh. Moderate difficulty. Return by train to Borough Green before walking back to Wrotham (approximately one mile).	8 miles
Sunday 21 July	Leisurely, fairly flat walk from Tonbridge Castle to Leigh and back, following the Wealdway to Haysden, and the Eden Valley Walk to Leigh. Rivers, lakes and typical Kent countryside make this a lovely walk.	7 miles
Wednesday 24 July	Circular walk from Meopham Green towards New Ash Green before heading down to Ridley and Culverstone Green. Moderate difficulty.	7.5 miles

JULY AT SHIPBOURNE FARMERS MARKET (Local produce made/grown by Local producers)

July really is the month to pay a visit to the Market. Not only is it full of locally grown fruit, vegetables and other produce at their peak but where else can you shop with views overlooking the Greensand Ridge on one side and the Common on the other.



Eating in July is all about keeping it simple as the glorious harvest of absurdly fresh locally produced ingredients reaches a peak that will run until September. Getting outside is the best idea this month so head off to the Farmers' Market and then pledge to spend as little time as possible in the kitchen preparing your purchases. Effortless eating should be the aim this month.

Don't miss tender BROAD BEANS, one of the true tastes of summer (freshly picked little pods can be enjoyed whole), fresh GREEN PEAS, radishes, beetroot, spring onions, spinach, and of course, new potatoes. Cucumbers, beans (both French and runner) and courgettes should be there alongside all kinds of salad leaves and great bunches of fresh herbs.

STRAWBERRIES and RASPBERRIES are all at their best now. Tom's delicious raspberries from Roughway Farm are usually freshly picked early in the morning of the Market. And don't miss out on CHERRIES as the season is now in full swing (Kentish cherries are justifiably world famous). This is the month for jam makers and you don't have to make huge vats of the stuff – just a few jars are incredibly satisfying to produce in your home kitchen, taste marvellous and make wonderful gifts.

Grass-fed summer LAMB is now at its very finest and, as a more fatty meat than some (giving it the meat flavour and keeps it from drying out), is ideal for the BBQ. Both Annabelle and Kieran have all the meat you need for a BBQ.

For seafood fans midsummer is a great time to enjoy CRAB – all you need to make a feast is to serve dressed crab with simply buttered new potatoes and good mayonnaise, homemade if possible. Serve with a chilled glass of one of the excellent English white wines such as the Yotes Court On the Nod Bacchus, available at the St Giles' Cooperative Stall (early morning tasters available from Gordon!)

MACKEREL is the prefect summer fish, iridescent in its blue and silver chainmail, bought fresh from the market and cooked the same day to enjoy at its very best. Try it barbecued, griddled or marinated in lime juice and chilli to slice and serve raw.

COOKERY CORNER

RASPBERRY SORBET

Serves 8-10

Ingredients

- 200g granulated sugar
- 500g raspberries, plus more to serve (optional)
- 1 lemon, juiced

Method

- 1. Stir sugar in 270ml water over a low heat until dissolved.
- 2. Raise the heat and simmer for 5 mins, until the liquid has become a syrup. Set aside to cool.
- 3. Put the raspberries and lemon juice in a food processor and blitz until smooth. Strain to remove seeds.
- 4. Combine with the sugar syrup, then pour into freezer-proof container.
- 5. Freeze for 1 hr 30 mins, then whisk with a balloon whisk or fork to break up any ice crystals that have formed and return to the freezer.
- 6. Then whisk again once an hour for 4 hrs to break up the ice crystals.

Serve with extra raspberries!
