

PLANS FOR THE NEW YEAR?

Who's got plans for the New Year? A holiday, maybe? A fitness target? Exam grades? It's part of the human condition that we make plans; we feel a sense achievement when plans come good, and frustration when they don't. There are plenty of proverbs to go with the habit of making plans, too: 'Without a vision, the people perish!' or 'best laid plans of mice and men...!' But does God have a plan... for you? The witness of scripture would suggest that the answer is 'Yes!':

"For surely I know the plans I have for you," says the Lord, "plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope."

These words were first spoken to the exiles in Babylon (c. 600 BC) by the prophet Jeremiah. You may feel the words aren't for you at all, but it is possible that they have an abiding truth, an open-ended value or an 'excess of meaning'. The verses that follow are instructive too:

"Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart" (Jeremiah 29:10-11)

As our churches step into the New Year, we remain committed to our role as welcoming host to all who would come and pray and search for the Lord. We have a special plan too: **May 17th**, Simon Buton-Jones, the Bishop of Tonbridge will be with us for a **Confirmation**. Confirmation is for any (age 12 and over) who have been baptized (usually as infants) and who want to make their own public commitment and receive the prayers of the bishop for more of God's Holy Spirit in their lives. Confirmation has also become the traditional 'point of entry' for receiving the bread and wine of Holy Communion. Details to be published near the time.

Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council is preparing a new Local Plan. The Local Plan will look ahead to 2042 and will provide a long-term vision and growth strategy for new development in the borough, providing a policy framework to help guide and shape the future of Tonbridge and Malling.

chance to offer comments to help shape the Plan before it is finalised for publication at Regulation 19 stage with further consideration next year. After the Regulation 19 consultation, we are not able to update the Plan, and comments submitted are sent to the Planning Inspectorate to be considered during the Local Plan Examination.

We encourage everyone to take part in our consultation, which will run from today 10 November to midnight on 2 January 2026. This is your opportunity to help shape how our borough grows and changes. FROM YOUR LOCAL MP

The Rt Hon Sir John Stanley, who served our community for 41 years, has died at the age of 83 following a short illness.

Sir John served Tonbridge and Malling as MP between 1974 and 2015. He dedicated much of his life to our concerns and cared deeply. I have learned so much from so many who have shared stories of his dedication to responding to those who needed his help.

Sir John was a tireless advocate of our rural community. He ran an extremely popular and successful Farmers and Growers Club which enabled him to make representations on behalf of those businesses who power our rural economy. I know he was extremely proud of what Shipbourne could contribute to this.

He also served with distinction in Parliament on the Foreign Affairs Committee and as a minister in government. Sir John had the privilege, as Margaret Thatcher's PPS, of being the one who welcomed her into Number 10 for the first time. He went on to bring through the law allowing council tenants to buy their homes, the biggest transfer of wealth in a generation.

From there he went on to serve as the Minister for the Armed Forces in the Ministry of Defence and later as a minister in the Northern Ireland Office. His unique style brought change and focus to each role. He served our country with distinction.

Even after he stepped down he was a kind friend and counsel to me and was the best predecessor I could ask for. No issue was too big or small for Sir John to deal with. In Parliament, he was devoted to serving his country in the same way he served our community.

I know I will not be alone in missing Sir John, he helped many of us in Kent, and across the United Kingdom. His life was one of dedication and service. I send my deepest condolences to Elizabeth and to his whole family.

THE GRANGE

Just as most of us were originally of peasant stock rising to more elevated social status through the centuries so the properties we occupied would often grow in stature over the years. Cottages were renamed houses and houses grew into mansions and, occasionally, a mansion became known as The Grange, a grand sounding name applied to imbue it and its occupants with the appearance of grandeur.

Originally a grange was a grain store often attached to – or serving - a large monastic building. There may also have been a modest farmhouse growing crops such as spelt, with apple orchards or livestock raised on its medieval farmland. But The Granges of Shipbourne and Plaxtol had little to do with monastic or medieval granaries.

Situated on the north of Shipbourne common The Grange was originally built as a hunting lodge for Fairlawne mansion, described on maps of 1846 and 1868 as The Lodge. This small property had by 1895 doubled in size to a solid red brick Victorian mansion, still very manageable as it *only* required five live-in household staff. It was intended as a Dower House - with a garage, outbuildings and stables - and renamed The Grange, as seen on the revised 1868 ordnance survey map of 1895 and map of 1907. In addition, a handsome semi-detached pair of Kentish ragstone cottages shown on an 1868 map as Grange Cottages were also rebuilt by the Cazalets for The Grange staff in 1873.

During WWI The Grange was let to the Weston family and before WWII was occupied by Peter Cazalet and his wife Leonora. Their daughter, Sheran, was born there as was their son Edward in 1936. He remembers it with great affection until - when Fairlawne was no longer tenanted - the family moved into the 'big house' in Plaxtol. The Grange fell into disrepair after WWII and was demolished in the 1960's after which several detached houses were built within the red brick walls that surrounded it. Fortunately, the cottages remain fronting The Green.

The house now known as The Grange in Plaxtol was originally an Elizabethan farmhouse – possibly a Hall House – known as Hubbles then Hale House. It was re-fronted in the Queen Anne style in 1702 and a tithe barn and oast built, still in existence. The

name changed in the 1800's to Stanley Grange, a family name and one more suited to its elevated status. When this family association ceased it became, simply, The Grange, which Edwin Lutyens, the celebrated architect, remodelled in 1926.

The Grange in Plaxtol continues to exert its importance in the landscape as the lane on which it stands – formerly known as Fenne Lane - is now called Grange Hill. Sadly, The Grange is Shipbourne is now only a distant memory.

JANUARY AT SHIPBOURNE FARMERS' MARKET

Following the Christmas rush, the stallholders and volunteers take a well-earned break and the Market reopens on **Thursday 15th January 2026**.



We have had footfall ups and downs in 2025 but finished on a high with over 180 attending the final Market of the year. We look forward to building our numbers in 2026 and welcoming returning and new customers.

An easy resolution to make this year is to eat well and enjoy good local food. With some planning and research, you should not only manage to eat better but also save money by shopping locally with the seasons. Not only that but supporting small local producers adds to your feel-good factor.

With short days and chilly nights we all crave comfort foods but after the excesses of the Christmas period, budgets are tight and healthier menus are in everyone's minds. So it's time to go minimal in the kitchen and enjoy simple clean dishes that satisfy. The brassica family neatly fits the bill. Kale, Savoy cabbage, sprouts and spring greens are all full of flavour now and don't need to be boiled to death. In fact they work perfectly in stir fries, hearty soups and curries, or serve them simply shredded and steamed tossed with a little seasoning, and a dash of cold pressed rapeseed oil (from our new supplier, Kentish Oils). Main crop potatoes, Jerusalem artichokes, parsnips, celeriac, swede and turnips provide the starch that keeps us going in the cold so mash them together to go with your meat dishes.

Lemon sole, halibut, skate and turbot are all good at this time of year – try them simply cooked on a griddle with a little oil to prevent sticking and a squeeze of lemon juice. Then sit back and really appreciate great fish at its very best. Venison is plentiful and with its lean flesh and high mineral content is great for those watching waistlines. The feathered game season comes to a close around the end of the month so now is a good time to use wild duck or pheasant in a casserole or pie.

COOKERY CORNER

CRISPY NEEPS 'N' TATTIES CAKE

This Scottish take on a rösti goes well with game, duck breast or roast chicken. Perfect as an accompaniment for Burns Night on 25th January.

Serves 6 as a side dish / Easy / Prep: 20 mins / Cook 1 hr

- 1 large swede peeled and cut into chunks
- 4 baking potatoes peeled and cut into chunks
- 50g butter
- Rapeseed oil for greasing
- 8 thin slices of pancetta or bacon

1. Boil the swede and potatoes in salted water for about 20 mins until completely tender, then drain well. Return to the pan under a very low heat for a few mins to dry out. Off the heat, bash the veg into a chunky mash with half the butter, a touch of salt and lots of pepper.
2. Heat oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Grease an ovenproof frying pan with a splash of oil and line the pan with the pancetta or bacon so it meets in the middle (like the stripes on the Union Flag). Press the veg into the dish (you can get up to this stage up to a day ahead and keep in the fridge). Dot with the remaining butter, then bake for about 40 mins until crisp and golden. Remove from the oven, turn out onto a board and cut into wedges.
